Treaty could benefit us in terms of becoming Self Governing. We would be free of the Indian Act & not run by the Federal Government. In the state our current Treaty is in, I believe more research & additions are required before it goes to final agreement.

More lot development with a series of duplexes or apartments would be beneficial for smaller household members. Aside from helping these families out, it could potentially generate some revenue when the units are paid off.
